Oxbow High School is a public school with grades seven through twelve. Enrollment is approximately 310 students. The Class of 2019 has 50 students and we have 28 teaching professionals. Students reside in six rural towns in Vermont and one in New Hampshire. Oxbow is governed by the towns of Bradford and Newbury, Vermont. Oxbow has one full-time Principal, and three counselors. River Bend Career and Technical Center is attached to Oxbow where students can choose to participate in part-day programs as juniors and seniors.
